How it works



DETAILS

WHEN: The webcast will screen live on National Canadian Film Day 150 - Wednesday, April 19, 2017!

The Q&A with the filmmakers will last an hour, starting in the early afternoon EST, and the exact time will be confirmed soon.

Note: If there's not enough time to show the film that morning, your students can watch it the day or even the week before.

WHO: High school classes grades 9 to 12. Groups can range from a single class to a few hundred students. Since the event will be in French, it is best suited to French classes or francophone classes studying any subject area.

PRICE: Like all REEL CANADA activities, this event is **completely free of charge!**

EQUIPMENT: Participating schools must have the means to screen the film, including speakers, projectors, etc. To participate in the Q&A, you require an internet connection and a screen large enough that all the students can see.
